- Our Among Friends meal program—help with preparing and delivering meals
- Helping meet daily needs of Afghan Evacuee families in Newburyport

Are you passionate about spending time with others, developing friendships, and helping others grow in relationship with each other? You can support our parish community by helping to organize:

- Coffee hours after the Sunday Eucharist
- Potlucks, Picnics, Barbecues
